

## ELL 1B – Course Outline

### **Course Description**

This course is designed for students who understand, read, speak, and write little or no English. Students are introduced to World literature and selected novels based on their grade level and individual instructional needs. The novels are selected from the approved reading list of the English Language Program of the district.

### **Objectives:**

The students will:

- 1 Increase their English vocabulary
- 2 Read short selections in English
- 3 Develop summarizing and sequencing skills
- 4 Improve comprehension skills
- 5 Identify the main idea of a story
- 6 Use oral skills to interpret stories
- 7 Develop an understanding of simple story elements and literary devices

### **Materials**

*High Point Basics/High Point Level A*

*High Point Basics Language Practice Book*

*High Point Basics Reading Practice Book/Level A Practice Book*

Novel selections based on grade level and individual needs

Various other supplementary materials will also be used

### **Required Materials**

All students must bring the following items to class **every day**:

- 1 Binder with section for ELL A
- 2 Pens, pencils, and erasers
- 3 **Completed homework assignments**

### **Class Expectations and Requirements:**

Students are required to follow all district and school rules and regulations as well as the following **classroom rules**:

**Attendance:**

Daily attendance is extremely important for your success in this class. When student is absent from school, he/she is responsible for obtaining and turning in any work missed. If the student misses a test, or a quiz, he/she need to make arrangements for a time to make up the quiz/test.

The student will receive a zero (0) for any work missed due to an unexcused absence.

**Homework:**

The student is expected to review the class notes on a nightly basis, even if there is no written homework for the night. No homework will be accepted after the due date, unless the student was absent from class.

**Grading Policy:**

Student's grade will be based on the total number of points accumulated on class participation, class work, homework, quizzes, tests, and projects divided by the total possible. The number of points assigned to each item will be determined by its length and complexity.
